



Prof. I. Nelson Rose

Professor of Law, Whittier Law School

Professor I. Nelson Rose is currently a Professor of Law at Whittier Law School. He is an internationally known scholar, author and public speaker, and is recognized as one of the world's leading experts on gaming law. He has served as a consultant and expert witness for numerous gaming institutions and has taught classes on gaming law to governments, universities, and other institutions around the world.

Since 2007, Prof. Rose has travelled frequently to Macau as a visiting professor at the University of Macau, teaching Gaming Law to lawyers from China and around the world. He has also published scholarly papers on Macau's gaming history and regulatory system in his internationally syndicated column, "Gambling and the Law®."

Among many other accomplishments in his career, Prof. Rose has taught classes on gaming law to the U.S. Federal Bureau of Investigation and was an expert witness for the federal government of Mexico in 2006 during the first NAFTA case involving gaming machines.

Prof. Rose received a J.D. from Harvard University in 1979 and a B.A. from the University of California, Los Angeles in 1973.
