



**Joshua Eisenman, Ph.D., Assistant Professor, University of Texas at Austin, Lyndon Johnson School of Public Affairs; Senior Fellow for China Studies, American Foreign Policy Council**

Before joining the American Foreign Policy Council in 2006, Dr. Eisenman served for two and half years as a policy analyst at the U.S.-China Economic and Security Review Commission. He has also worked as fellow at the New America Foundation and assistant director of China Studies at the Center for the National Interest (formally The Nixon Center). Dr. Eisenman has lectured at numerous venues around the world, including the Council on Foreign Relations, Harvard University, the Asia Society in Hong Kong, and the Central Party School of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of China.

Dr. Eisenman's second book, *China and Africa: A Century of Engagement* (University of Pennsylvania Press), coauthored with former U.S. Ambassador to Ethiopia David H. Shinn, was named one of the top three books on Africa in 2012 by *Foreign Affairs* magazine. In 2007, he co-edited *China and the Developing World: Beijing's Strategy for the 21st Century* (ME Sharpe) with U.S. Ambassador to Myanmar Derek J. Mitchell. His work on Chinese politics and international relations has appeared in *The National Interest*, *Current History*, the *International Herald Tribune*, the *Wall Street Journal Asia*, and *Newsweek*.

Dr. Eisenman holds a Ph.D. in political science from UCLA, an M.A. in international relations from the Johns Hopkins University Paul H. Nitze School of Advanced International Studies (SAIS), and a B.A. in East Asian studies from George Washington University Elliott School of International Affairs.
